Medieval Extranía

A divergence for this month. I have mentioned, when starting this, that the Orthodox Church had their own version of the 'Book of Hours' called the Horologion. Unlike the Books of the Hours, it was far less of a Layman' book and more of a concise framework for actual services. (Though I've seen some indication that 4 of the shorter hours may have been extracted.) The Horologion itself provided the fixed portions of the service. The ones that did not change throughout the liturgical year. Books such as the Psalter (book of Psalms), Menaion (Which provided liturgical texts for specific days throughout the year, twelve volumes), Various references for Saints, Specific alterations for liturgical season (The Pentecostion is dedicated to the season between Pacha, called Easter in the Catholic parts of the English speaking worlds, and Pentecost.) They tended not to be as highly decorated as especially later period Books of the Hours became being primarily a reference text that was expected to be used several times a day.
